Professor Ian McDonald: Professor Ian McDonald graduated with a PhD from Simon Fraser University in 1974. After completing his PhD, he took up a lecturing position at the University of Melbourne, where he was promoted to Senior Lecturer in 1981, Reader in 1986 and Professor in 1990. He was appointed an Emeritus Professor in March 2012 following his retirement. He has held visiting positions at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Reserve Bank of Australia, Monash University, Nanyang University, Oxford University and Queen's University. He has held several leadership positions at Melbourne including Head of the Department of Economics from 1993 to 1996 and Deputy Dean, Faculty of Economics and Commerce, University of Melbourne, 1999-2002 and 2005. McDonald is a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences, Australia and an Editor of the Australian Economic Review. He has published 5 books, including an excellent textbook in Macroeconomics, 15 Chapters in Books and 88 Journal Articles. His main fields of study are Behavioural Economics and Macroeconomics. He has over 3,500 citations, according to Google Scholar. He has published, *inter alia*, in the *American Economic Review*, *Quarterly Journal of Economics*, *Journal of Macroeconomics*, *International Journal of Industrial Organization*, *Games and Economic Behaviour*, *Economic Inquiry*, *Economica*, *Scottish Journal of Political Economy*, *Oxford Economic Papers*, *Manchester School*, *Journal of Economic Education*, *Journal of Economic Psychology*, *Economic Modelling* and he has published a large number of papers in the *Economic Record*, the *Australian Economic Review* and *Australian Economic Papers*. He is best known for his important papers with Solow.
