Professor Lisa Cameron: Professor Lisa Cameron is a prolific and imaginative author working in the field of development economics and experimental economics. She has coupled those two specialisations with insights from Behavioural economics. Her focus on developing countries has involved our near neighbour, Indonesia. She is, therefore, following in the illustrious steps of Heinz Arndt, a Distinguished Fellow of the Economic Society who pioneered studies in the Indonesian economy. Cameron, however, is drilling down to the microeconomic level looking at human behaviour to various economic stimuli. However, she has looked at public health and ongoing infrastructural needs of the Indonesian economy. Lisa has more than 6,000 citations and is ranked in the top 25% of Australian economists, according to the REPEC. She has more than 101 authored works. She has been invited to give keynote addresses at many international conferences. Cameron has also looked at how women fare in the economic development process. On a larger canvas she has spoken in favour of a greater gender balance in the economics discipline and has contributed enormously to the Women in Economics Network. Cameron has also contributed three articles to the Economic Record, one of which with Mark Crosby (2007), was entitled 'It's the Economy, Stupid; Macroeconomics and the Federal election'. At the pastoral level, Cameron has supervised 14 doctoral candidate students and is a doctoral examiner to many dissertations. She is currently a professorial research fellow at the Melbourne Institute of Applied Economic and Social Research at the University of Melbourne and she has a doctorate from Princeton University.
